## ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE NATIONAL ELECTORAL COMMISSION AFTER THE PRESS CONFERENCE HELD ON

## 5 JULY 2010 AT 1:10 CET AT THE NEC'S HEADQUARTERS

On 5 July 2010 at 1:10 CET at the headquarters of the National Electoral Commission, another press conference was held concerning the partial unofficial results of the second round of the Polish Presidential Election.

NEC's Chairman, Judge Stefan Jaworski opened the conference and announced the partial unofficial results of the Polish Presidential Election determined at 00:58 CET on 5 July 2010.

On the basis of the data received electronically concerning the results of the election from 20 719 polling stations, which constitute 80,39% of the total number of polling stations, the National Electoral Commission announces that the partial unofficial results of the election with regard to the number of votes cast for individual candidates are as follows:

1) Number of eligible voters: 23 929 687;

2) Number of ballot cards issued: 13 117 811;

3) Turnout: 54,82%;

4) Total number of valid votes cast countrywide: 12 963 547;

5) Number of valid votes cast for individual candidates was as follows:

Minister Kazimierz Czaplicki explained the difference between the results provided by opinion polls, and the partial results announced by the National Electoral Commission. Minister emphasized that opinion polls are held among a randomly selected, representative group of polling stations. On the other hand, the partial results announced by the National Electoral Commission include the votes counted by Regional Electoral Commissions.

At the conference, NEC's Secretary explained the rules of the verification of votes cast in the Presidential Election. The protocols from Local Electoral Commissions are submitted to Regional Electoral Commissions. After their formal and substantive verification, they are approved, and finally entered into the system of the National Electoral Bureau.

Minister Kazimierz W. Czaplicki also mentioned 13 constituencies, which submitted all the protocols, including i.a. Kraków, Chełm, Piła, Konin, Zamość and Włocławek.
