

**ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE NATIONAL ELECTORAL COMMISSION AFTER THE
PRESS CONFERENCE HELD ON
4 JULY 2010 AT 18:30 CET AT THE NEC'S HEADQUARTERS**

On 4 July 2010 at 18:30 CET at the headquarters of the National Electoral Commission, the third conference was held concerning the second round of the Polish Presidential Election.

NEC's Deputy Chairman, Judge Jan Kacprzak opened the press conference. Judge Maria Grzelka provided information on the number of electors registered on electoral lists, to whom ballot cards were issued by 17:00 CET in the second round of the Presidential Election ordered for 4 July 2010.

On the basis of the information received from 25 504 local electoral commissions out of 25 505 local electoral commissions appointed countrywide, the National Electoral Commission provides the following information as at 17.00 CET on 4 July 2010:

- 1. The number of eligible electors, i.e. the number of electors registered on electoral lists in the polling stations which provided the information amounted to 30 391 450.**
- 2. 12 795 128 ballot cards were issued to the eligible voters, which constitutes 42,10% of the total number of eligible voters.**

In comparison, in the first round of the election held on 20 June 2010, the turnout countrywide amounted to 41,57 %.

In comparison with the total number of the eligible voters, the highest turnout has been recorded in the borough (city) of Rewal, Gryficki District, Zachodniopomorskie Voivodeship - 78,32%. Two weeks ago, in the first round of the election, the highest turnout as at 17:00 CET was recorded in Ustronie Morskie, Kołobrzeski District, Zachodniopomorskie Voivodeship - 76,72%.

Deputy Chairman Judge Jan Kacprzak provided the information that the ballot card reserves in holiday resorts across the country had been activated.
