

## ANNOUNCEMENT

### AFTER THE PRESS CONFERENCE OF THE NATIONAL ELECTORAL COMMISSION HELD ON 20 JUNE 2010 AT 18:30 CET AT THE NEC'S HEADQUARTERS

On 20 June 2010 at 18.30 CET the next press conference was held concerning the Polish Presidential Elections 2010.

The following participated in the conference:

NEC's Deputy Chairman Judge Jan Kacprzak opened the conference by giving the floor to Judge Andrzej Kisielewicz, who announced the information concerning the turnout as at 17:00 CET. According to the official announcement the information is as follows:

#### I. Collective information countrywide

On the basis of the data received electronically from **25 448** polling stations out of the total number of **25605** polling stations established countrywide, the National Electoral Commission announces that on 20 June 2010 as at 17:00 CET:

1. Number of eligible voters, i.e. persons registered on the lists of electors at the polling stations which have submitted the information was **30 487 795**.
2. **12 674 996** ballot cards were issued, which constitutes **41,57%** of the total number of eligible voters

III. In relation to the number of eligible voters, the highest turnout was recorded in Ustronie Morskie Borough, Kołobrzeski District, Zachodniopomorskie Voivodship -

76,72% .

Next, Deputy Chairman Jan Kacprzak informed of the turnout in the areas affected by the recent floods. As at 17.00 CET the turnout was as follows:

In comparison, the turnout recorded at 16.30 CET in the Presidential Election 2005 was 35,45%, and in the first round of the previous Presidential Election in general - 49,74 %.

**Next, Judge Maria Grzelka reminded that the vote is to last from 6.00 to 20.00 CET. Whereas at some polling stations abroad it had already finished, e.g. in the USA. However, considering the continuing election silence effective in Poland and abroad, the results can only be published after 20.00 CET. Any cases of violation of election silence will be penalized.**

**While NEC reminded that it did not announce the lowest turnout, it informed that the highest turnout was recorded in the seaside towns of Rewal, Dźwirzyno, Dziwnowo and Ustronie Morskie. In the town of Rewal, the total number of 5.000 ballot cards were issued, including 2.000 voters with certificates enabling them to cast their vote outside their designated precinct.**

**As to the turnout at the polling stations located abroad, the National Electoral Commission announced that it does not collect such information due to the fact that the information is still being submitted to the Regional Electoral Commission in Warsaw, as well as time zone differences. In addition, the number of electors added to the lists – with reference to the whole population is 184 880.**
