

**ANNOUNCEMENT AFTER THE PRESS CONFERENCE OF THE NATIONAL
ELECTORAL COMMISSION HELD ON
21 JUNE 2010 AT 2:30 CET AT THE NEC'S HEADQUARTERS**

On 21 June 2010 at 02:30 CET the next press conference was held at the seat of the National Electoral Commission concerning the Polish Presidential Elections 2010.

The following participated in the conference:

The conference was opened by NEC's Chairman Judge Stefan Jaworski. Next, Judge Maria Grzelka announced the partial unofficial results of the Presidential Election determined as at 2:19 CET on 21 June 2010.

On the basis of the data received electronically concerning the results of the election from 18 305 polling stations, i.e. 71,02% of the total number of polling stations, the National Electoral Commission informs that the partial unofficial results of the election with regard to the number of votes cast for individual candidates are as follows:

- 1) Number of eligible voters: 20 878 919;**
- 2) Number of ballot cards issued: 11 277 789;**
- 3) Turnout: 54,02%;**
- 4) Total number of valid votes cast countrywide: 11 194 325;**
- 5) Number of valid votes cast for individual candidates was:**
